

EMIGRATIN IN NUMBERS AND MAPS

All emigrants from the book captured



- All emigrants listed in the book "Die Auswanderung auf den Härten" written by Dr. Walter Schmid have been extracted from the church records including their parents and grand parents and connected to existing stored people.
- The emigrants have been published on Ancestry.com/ Rootsweb.com and can be found there
- If a contact is made I regularly trade information about the descendants of the emigrant against the ancestry information
- Partially I can connect them to relatives either in Germany or in the countries the emigrants have settled

Reasons for emigration

- Economic (poor family situation or the city has paid the ticket)
- Avoid military service
- Avoid arrest (trouble with the police)
- Interesting incentives by acquisitions
 - Ticket have to be paid by work alternative way of slavery
 - Offer of land (e.g. Romania, Bessarabia) for settlement purposes or reclamation of land

Period of the emigration

• Start: 1752

• Main period: 1830 – 1850

• Stop: 1906


How were the starting conditions?

- Only a few emigrants stayed in the cities. The majority tried to start first with relatives or friends and then to purchase their own land
- The purchase of land very often meant that the land had first to be reclaimed
- With economic success more land was purchased (regularly more west)
- As a rule you can say: Later meant more west. High concentration of settlements in Ohio and Indiana and around the Great Lakes


EMIGRATION IN NUMBERS - OVERALL -

Currently captured: 1.782 persons, from 703 of them I know where they settled respectively died


Distribution by name




Emigration by birth place








Emigration by destination countries






Emigration by names



Emigration by destination countries





- Johann Adam Riehle*Oct 30, 1864 in Maehringen, +Apr 17, 1926 in Edgerton, Williams Co., OH, emigrated in 1881. His brother Johann Jacob Riehle died in 1883 in the North See in front of the island Borkum due to the loss of ship "Cimbria"

SPECIALS IN MAEHRINGEN

The church bells of St. Stephan

- When we had been on the bell tower in 2001 just at the moment the bells were ringing for 11:00 am Jackie was extremely quite when we were back down in the church
- When I asked her whether she was ok, she answered. "Yes but I'm completely overwhelmed by my feelings. It means so much to me to hear the same bells my ancestors have heard and stay in the same church as they did.
- She was right. Two of these bells are ringing for centureis. They determined the start and the end of the day and they called for lunch, when people hat been on the fields



The church bells of St. Stephan



- This is the oldest church bell in the county. She was made in the first half of the 13. century by an unknown bell founder
- The inscription reads:
 Ivcas macvs mathevs iohannes





- This bell was made in the 15th century by Hans Eger from Reutlingen. It is likely that she was produced after the end of the hostilities between Hans v. Rechberg and some Swabian Cities where also Maehringen was affected
- The inscription reads::
 S LVCAS S MARCVS S MATHEVS S IOHANNES



The Oberreuther monument



This monument of love was erected by Johann Friedrich Oberreuther on the grave of his wife Anna Maria Grauer The inscription reads::

Denkhmahl der aufrichtigen Liebe bey dem Grabe seine Im 41 Jährig. Ehestand treu gewesene Ehegattin, weyl. Frauen/Frauen Anna Maria Oberreuterin einer gebohrenen Grauerin, Förster allhier/welche nach einer langwierigen Waßersucht endlich von dem lieben Gott, den 5. May 1775 gnädiglich aufgelöst und d. 7. May, als Dom. Jubilate Christlich Zur Erden bestattet worden.

Anna Maria (Riehle) Knapp

- Anna Maria Riehle was the first in the family who emigrated in 1899 auswanderte.
- Her husband, Georg Knapp, born Aug 13, 1861 in Betzingen emigrated already 1880 to Amerika and settled in the region of Harrington, WA
- In 1899 he came back to Germany and was searching a woman. He choose Anna Maria. Very likely they were married in Germany before they returned into the U.S.
- They had seven children

Anna Margarethe (Riehle) Entrican

- Anna Margarethe Riehle emigrated in 1902 into the USA together with her brother Johann Georg
- She married on Dec 21, 1904 David Orr Entrican (* Oct 5, 1870)
- They had six children

Johann Georg Riehle


- Johann Georg emigrated in 1902 into the USA together with his sister Anna Margarethe Riehle
- He married on Feb 22, 1911 Edna Ulrich (*Sep 10, 1884 in Le Sueur Co., Minnesota)
- They had seve children
- After his arrival in the USA Johann Georg worked for his brother-in-law in Harrington, WA. After a while he purchased his own farm. 1915 the farm house was burning down and had to be rebuild.
- In 1934 Johann Georg sold the old farm and purchased the Borck farm. The farm was operated later by his son Paul.
- His last years Johann Georg lived in Los Angeles, where he died as well


